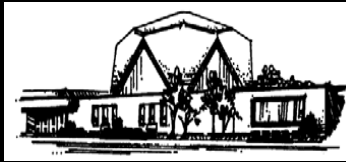

Tisha B'Av

Community Tisha B'Av Service

Monday, August 8th 7:30 PM
At Beth Hillel Synagogue

This mourning day is observed by joint services with all the Conservative congregations of greater Hartford. Tisha B'Av, the Fast of the Ninth of [Av](#), is a day of mourning to commemorate the many tragedies that have befallen the [Jewish people](#), many of which coincidentally have occurred on the ninth of Av. Tisha B'Av means "the ninth (day) of Av.

Tisha B'Av primarily commemorates the destruction of the first and second [Temples](#), both of which were destroyed on the ninth of Av. Although this holiday is primarily meant to commemorate the destruction of the Temple, it is

appropriate to consider on this day the many other tragedies of the Jewish people, many of which occurred on this day, most notably the expulsion of the Jews from Spain in 1492. Tisha B'Av is the culmination of a three week period of increasing mourning, beginning with the [fast of the 17th of Tammuz](#), which commemorates the first breach in the walls of Jerusalem, before the First Temple was destroyed. Traditional customs during this three week period include not scheduling weddings and other parties refraining from cutting their hair. From the first to the ninth of Av, it is customary to refrain from eating meat or drinking wine (except on the [Shabbat](#)) and from wearing new clothes.

Try to attend and welcome our fellow Conservative Jews. It is good that Beth Hillel is actively part of our Hartford synagogue "hevra!"

Most of us have become experts at "multi-tasking;" we juggle many activities at the same time. Here in the synagogue office we are juggling summer vacation schedules, planning for the upcoming High Holy Days, dealing with ongoing office and synagogue activities, as well as... and perhaps most importantly, trying to set a new and more focused path for the future. We had a special service in June whereat we extended appreciation to outgoing officers and installed new leaders. Sydney Schulman is now President of our congregation. So between our Shabbatot Under the Stars on July 22 and August 12, these discussions on identity, and our ongoing Shabbat morning worship, will make it very meaningful to spend part of your summers here at Beth Hillel Synagogue. The President's Column *by Sydney Schulman*

"We are Family"

Good Evening, Beth Hillel Family:

I write this first column as president at 1:30a.m. Eastern time. The only problem is that I am in Seattle, Washington where it is 10:30p.m. I'm attending the Lions Clubs International Convention. There is a lot of conversation here about the Lions "family." I think of our Beth Hillel "family" believe that we can pull it together again and be successful! What it takes is desire and enthusiasm. Without both, we will fail. After all, how do you receive a product from a bored salesman? I will hazard a guess that at least half the congregation knows an unaffiliated person of our faith in Bloomfield and its surrounding towns. Why is he or she unaffiliated? The likelihood is one of the following:

1. It's too much money.
2. I'm not very religious and don't do all the religious stuff you do as a member.
3. I'm very busy with my family and friends and some of the friends aren't Jewish.
4. My spouse or significant other isn't Jewish and/or therefore, we don't feel welcome.
5. I don't have time.
6. My social life and things I enjoy are not related to the synagogue.

If we are going to be successful, each one of you, not just the membership committee, has to talk to each of these people you know and to respond to those reasons. In biblical times, the synagogue was not just a place to pray. It was the center of community life. Of course, it didn't have the competition that we have today for the attention of the people. We have to show people that we can answer the reasons they are not interested.

1. We want you. We will deal with the money issue.

2. We don't just practice our religion here. You may do as much or as little as you like. We are not here to judge.
3. We welcome participation in our social activities by your non-Jewish friends. Bring them along with you. We particularly would like to do the same activities you do with your family. What do you like to do? We will have others who like it also and may make it a part of our synagogue, if it's not already here.
4. You, your spouse and/or significant other are most welcome. Indeed, we have others with non-Jewish spouses and significant others who are all welcomed as part of our "extended family."
5. There is no required amount of time you have to spend. Come as frequently as you can or would like to. In fact, if we do the things you enjoy, you might find yourself coming more often.
6. Our commitment to you is to share the things you and your family enjoy and, by being family with you, to have you suddenly realize to your surprise, that it can be spiritually rewarding also.

Let's look at what successful religious institutions offer and build our family again around those concepts!

Every new moment is a moment to turn things around!

"in Action"

Walk Against Hunger (Foodshare) was ably chaired by Deb Gutcheon. We raised \$1367. Many people generously contributed. Reba Nassua, Richard Gutcheon, Len Swade, Tammi Krashaur and 4000 people walked and over one-half million dollars were raised!

Backpack Food Program: on Thursday afternoons, Myrna and Marvin Schaffman, and Len Swade pack. Contributions are needed to feed food insecure Bloomfield High Schoolers for weekends. Williams-Hyacinth was recently awarded the Bloomfield non-profit of the year.

Hunger Action Team: we meet at Foodshare to discuss and work at reducing hunger in Bloomfield. Currently, we are trying to plan an after school food and enrichment program for Bloomfield students, similar to the one in Hartford being done by the House of Bread thru the Boys-Girls Clubs.

Windsor may have a hunger action team. Since there are Windsor BHS member, it would be nice for BHS to do some social action programming in Windsor.

Bloomfield Soup Kitchen. at the Bloomfield Methodist Church: Joel Neuwirth and Len Swade volunteer and are on the planning committee.



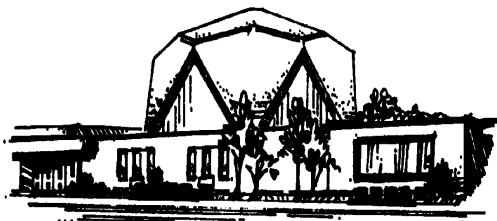
